Under current Texas law, you appear to have two (2) years from the date of occurrence in which to file a lawsuit. However, the Texas Supreme Court periodically changes the law and circumstances affecting the statute of limitations for various types of cases, which may effect when the statute of limitations in your particular case will run. Remember – under Texas law you are forever prevented from filing a lawsuit unless it is done within the deadlines set out above.
